Students desiring to take the course must write a personal statement describing their interest in learning about the legal and practical aspects of solo and small firm practice and provide it to Professor Luppino on or before March 19. Preference will be given to qualified 2Ls (who will be 3Ls next fall). Class will not meet every Wednesday, just on the following dates: May 20, May 27, June 3, June 17 & June 24. The course requires attendance at the Missouri Bar Solo & Small Firm Conference at the Lake of the Ozarks June 11 – 13, 2009. Students pay only regular course tuition and fees and do not have to pay costs for the conference. Students desiring to take this class and Jury Selection (L8895S) can do so by arriving earlier on Thursday for the conference and leaving Friday night.
